Mini-Pig Shampoo

- **DO NOT USE ON PREGNANT SOWS.**
- **DO NOT USE ON THE SAME DAY AS WORMING YOUR GUINEA** – leave 48 hours in between worming and applying the shampoo.
- **DO NOT LEAVE THE SHAMPOO ON FOR 3-4 MINUTES AS WITH ADULTS.**

This shampoo has been designed especially for Mini-Pigs© The term "Mini-Pig" applies to guineas under 3 months old – after this, you can use the other shampoos designed for older guineas. Guineaes under 3 months old don't usually need shampooing unless they have some kind of a skin problem. If you need to shampoo your Mini-Pig, this is a very gentle shampoo containing a small amount of Chamomile and Lavender Essential Oils.

1. Wet your Mini-Pig and put a strip of shampoo down your guinea's spine, massage in well. Don't forget the ears and face need cleaning too! Scrape off some foam from the guinea's body and use the foam (not the shampoo) to massage gently into both sides of their ears. Be careful not to get shampoo in their eyes or mouth. Rinse thoroughly and ensure all traces of shampoo are removed.
2. This shampoo does contain conditioning ingredients, but if your guinea has long hair, or very dry hair / skin, use the Gorgeous Guineaes Lavender Conditioner. Again, just apply the Conditioner and rinse off straight away.
3. Towel-dry your guinea.
4. Whether you leave your guinea to dry naturally or use a hairdryer on a low heat, you must ensure that your guinea is kept warm and is completely dry before putting him back into a **clean cage** (especially in the winter).

NB: It is very important to ensure that shampoos and conditioners are rinsed-off thoroughly.

Regular monthly shampooing with Gorgeous Guineaes shampoo can help to prevent skin problems.

None of our shampoos contain any artificial colours – any colour comes from the Essential Oils.

There are 3 key things that you can do to help prevent skin problems from occurring in the first place:

1. Bathe your guinea every 4 - 6 weeks with Gorgeous Guineaes Shampoo.
2. Clean cages at least twice a week using a good disinfectant such as ConfiClean / Formula H.
3. Avoid using shavings or sawdust, both are highly absorbent and can take moisture away from your guinea's skin, leaving them more prone to skin problems. The dust can also lead to respiratory disease that can be fatal. Use lots of fresh hay on top of newspaper instead, or MediBed / Equisorb / Jopack / Hippofan (horse bedding).
